

Magnolia Paper Flower Instructions



Supplies Needed

3 coordinating double sided heavy weight pattern papers

Floral Wire

Floral Tape

Glue Dots

Adhesive (Tape Runner Preferred)

Scissors

Pencil for tracing

Petal pattern

Instructions

1. Using pattern provided, trace and cut 6 small petals and 6 large petals from two coordinating double sided pattern papers

2. Cut one 2X12" strip from third pattern paper

3. Cut strip into fringe by snipping the strip along the 12" side.

(Hint: Keep snips as close together as possible. The more pieces that are cut, the fuller your flower will be. Also, be careful not to snip through entire strip.)

4. Once strip is completely fringed, adhere one end to floral wire using a glue dot.



5. Wrap fringe around itself until it forms a tight cylinder around the floral wire. (it will look like a broomstick)

6. Secure with adhesive or glue dot.

7. Using adhesive or glue dots, adhere base of small petals to fringe cylinder. (this will form a second layer to the cylinder. Petals will overlap.)



8. Once all six small petals are adhered, repeat the process with the large petals.





9. Wrap entire flower base and stem with floral wire.

10. Peel each petal away from base and curl by wrapping it around a pen.

11. Open up fringe and fluff to form flower center.



Feel free to experiment with different shapes and sizes of petals. Each variation will make change the flowers dramatically.

Frill Paper Flower Instructions



Supplies Needed

3 coordinating double sided heavy weight pattern papers

Floral Wire

Floral Tape

Glue Dots

Adhesive (Tape Runner Preferred)

Scissors

Pencil for tracing

Petal pattern

Instructions

Cut the following strips from the double sided pattern papers:

Pattern 1: 3X12

Pattern 2: 2X12

Pattern 3: 1.5X12

1. Using scissors, cut strips into fringe by snipping straight lines close together along entire strip. Do not cut through entire strip. Leave 1/4 border

(hint: Keep snips as close together as possible. The more pieces that are cut, the fuller your flower will be. Also, be careful not to snip through entire strip.)

2. Once strip is completely fringed, adhere one end to floral wire using a glue dot.

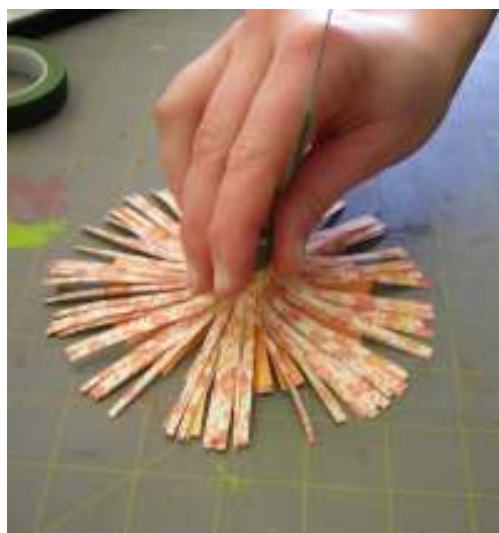


3. Apply adhesive to bottom of small fringe strip and wrap fringe around wire to create a tight cylinder.



4. Apply adhesive and wrap medium fringe around small fringe, followed by the large. This will create a multi-layered cylinder.

5. Press all fringe outward using fingertips. Each piece of fringe should be flattened as much as possible. Use tabletop to flatten more if necessary.



6. Wrap exposed wires with floral tape to make a stem.
