## All tied up



Fold the square napkin in half.



With the opening of the long side at the top place utensils on the left end.



Roll the utensils inside of the napkin.





Place the loose edge of the napkin to the back. Using a 25-30" piece of ribbon slide it under the roll and about 1" from the bottom. Center the ribbon and bring the loose ends around to the front and tie a knot. Wrap the loose ends behind the roll crossing in the back and back into the front. Tie another knot. Continue until the ribbon covers the entire length of the roll and finish with either a bow in the front or loose ends cut at an angle

## Envelope



Fold the square napkin in half diagnoally 1/8" from the top.



Fold the two bottom corners in meeting in the middle.



Bring the two sides in once again to meet in the middle.



Fold the bottom half up to the point just below the flap.



Fold the top flap down as if it were an envelope.



"Seal" with a name tag, leaf, cookie, or any other small object.

#### Ribbon Accent



Fold the square napkin in half diagonally.



Fold in half again creating a smaller triangle.



Holding at the point grab the napkin about four inches down and tie a ribbon, or string around the napkin. Fluff to gain desired look.

#### Knot



Fold the square napkin in half.



Tie a knot in the top half of the napkin so it looks like a lopsided bow.



Tuck one end of a small piece of ribbon into the knot and if desired attach a name plate to the portion hanging out.

## Bird of Paradise



Fold a square napkin in quarters. Fold the now smaller square in



Fold the now smaller square in half creating a triangle.



Fold the sides in to meet in the middle.



Fold the points that hang off the bottom around to the back side forming a triangle.



Fold the triangle in half so that the sides you just folded under are touching.



Set the napkin down so the loose corner points are on top. Carefully pull each point up forming the petals.

#### Corn Cob



Fold the square napkin in half diagnoally.



Bring the two side points up to meet at the middle point.



Bring the pointed end with folds up about 2" from the top.



Fold the point of the smaller triangle back down to meet the bottom.



Carefully flip the napkin to the back side and fold the point of the right side back about an inch.



Fold each side back to meet in the middle and tuck the right side into the fold on the left side.



Turn the napkin back around and peel the two flaps down to look like corn husks.

# Fleur de Lys



Fold the square napkin in half diagnoally.



With the folded edge at the top bring the pointed end up to overlap the top edge about an inch.



Accordian fold the napkin from left to right with about 1 1/2" folds.



Grab the base if the napkin and insert into a glass or napkin ring allowing the edges to fall.
