

## College Graduates Contribute to the Utah Economy

- Individuals with higher education credential are less likely to experience unemployment.

#### HIGHER EDUCATION MEANS HIGHER PERSONAL INCOME

- Holding a postsecondary degree is clearly related to higher earnings, although there is variation across disciplines.
- Each successive level of education attainment results in additional economic benefit.
- The median income for bachelor's degree holders in Utah is \$50,381, compared to \$32,176 for people with only a high school diploma.



#### SOCIETAL BENEFITS OF HIGHER EDUCATION


- The percentage of people who donate their time to organizations increases as their level of education increases.

### PARENTAL EDUCATION LEVELS BENEFIT CHILDREN


 Children whose parents had higher levels of education scored better on math tests upon entering kindergarten.

- States with a higher proportion of their population with a bachelor's degree or higher have higher personal income levels.
