Once he got to the house/drop point, he had the kids wait inside the car and took Susan inside and restrained her. She would be unable to resist due to the poison. He then locked the house and went back to the car, if the Boys awoke he could have said Mom was at the Doctor. He likely drove around and Camped with the Kids until the next day. Returning home, he claimed no knowledge of where Susan was. That way he could swear and possibly pass a polygraph, that he went camping, he did kill Susan, because he would not actually know if she died. He probably had camping gear/sleeping bags in the car. The guestion is where did he put her and will we find her before she does die. One possibility is that she is still alive, but we need to find her before she does die, if the poison was not a fatal dose, she may recover and be found. She probably would have no idea she had been poisoned.
