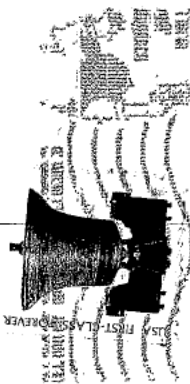

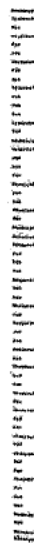

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Dear Dad,

Hi... So, I hope by now you got the money order and other letter I sent for you. I think it probably went out with Thursday's mail. You told me you needed the money order on Tuesday, right? I got one the same night, but didn't manage to get it in the mail before it was picked up on Wednesday since I slept in a bit, forgot, and then it had already come by the time I got to the box. Grr. But, today is Saturday, and even if it isn't there yet, I can't imagine it won't arrive on Monday at the latest.

But anyway, attached is the Power of Attorney. I still haven't received your letter, but today's mail hasn't come yet so I'm hoping it'll be here today at latest. I'll check the mail when I put this in the box, although I'm hoping to get this in the box before the mail has arrived :P If it's come for the day I might just go to the PO so it doesn't sit around another two days, heh.

So, as we speak, Mike is sitting around with his attorney in Tacoma, potentially being deposed (assuming that [REDACTED] and the Coxes didn't screw things up so badly that they caused the deposition not to happen). DURABLE POWER OF ATTORNEY

I, Steven C. Powell, resident of the State of Washington, revoke any powers of attorney I may have given in the past and give Alina D. Powell (referred to below as "the agent") a durable power of attorney. I intend that it not be limited by any disability I may have in the future.

1. POWERS

A. The agent shall act on my behalf and for my benefit, and shall have all powers over my estate that I have or acquire. These shall include, but not be limited to, the following: the power to make deposits to, and payments from, any account in my name in any financial institution; the power to open and remove items from any safe deposit box in my name; the power to sell, exchange or transfer title to stocks, bonds or other securities; the power to sell, convey or encumber any real or personal property; the power to create, reinstate, amend, cancel, borrow against, reduce, increase, or otherwise modify, any insurance policies which currently exist or which must be created or reinstated as determined to be necessary by the agent.

B. The agent shall have the power to consent to, or to withhold consent from, medical treatment; shall have all powers necessary or desirable to provide for my support, maintenance, health and comfort; the agent shall be entitled to obtain and use any of my medical records or other individually identifiable health information to the same extent as I would myself. This is intended as a full release of all information governed by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA).

2. EFFECTIVE DATE, REVOCATION AND DISPOSITION OF REMAINS

A. This power of attorney shall become effective immediately.

B. It shall remain in effect until revoked or until my death.

C. After my death, my agent shall have the authority to act as my representative for purposes of controlling the disposition of my remains, as authorized under RCW 68.50.16, if I have not otherwise made lawful provision for their disposition.

D. I may revoke this power of attorney by giving written notice to the agent and, if the power of attorney has been recorded, by recording the written instrument of revocation in the county office where deeds are recorded.

E. If I give notice of revocation after my agent has certified that I lack the mental capacity to make important decisions, then my agent's power of attorney shall be suspended unless and until a court determines that the revocation was not effective.

3. RIGHTS AND DUTIES OF THE AGENT

A. My estate shall hold the agent harmless from, and indemnify the agent for, all liability for acts done for me in good faith based on this power of attorney.

B. The agent shall be required to account to any subsequently appointed personal representative.

4. NOMINATION OF GUARDIAN

I nominate the agent for consideration by the court as my guardian or limited guardian in the event that any guardianship proceeding for my person or estate should be commenced.

5. SUBSTITUTE AGENT

I appoint Michael C. Powell to serve as substitute agent in place of the agent named in paragraph 1 above, if the agent named in paragraph 1 is unable to serve due to death or incapacitation, or is unwilling to serve. Substitution of agent will be made only under the following conditions:

A. In the event of the agent's death, the substitute agent must provide proof of death in the form of a death certificate.

B. In the event of physical or mental incapacitation preventing the agent named in paragraph 1 above from serving, the substitute agent must provide proof of the incapacitation, including but not limited to a letter from a medical doctor attesting to the agent's incapacitation.

C. In the event that the agent named in paragraph 1 above is unwilling to serve despite otherwise being able to, the agent named in paragraph 1 above will sign a resignation transferring the rights, responsibilities, and duties outlined in this durable Power of Attorney to the substitute agent.
