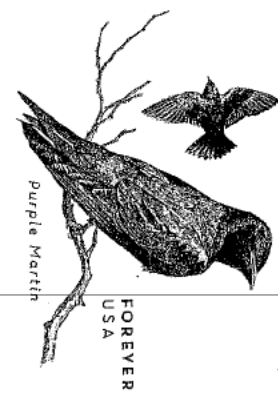

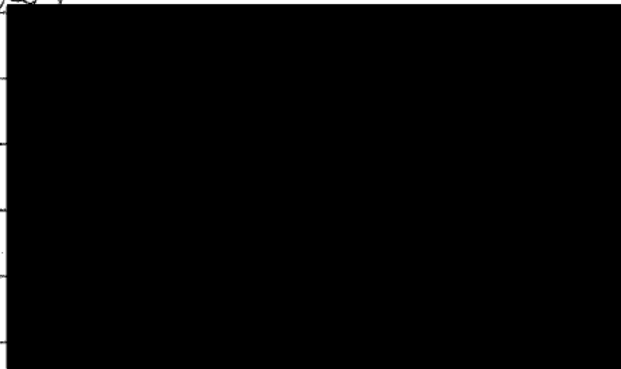

I almost forget about this appeal, there are so many things on my mind. My attorney info is as follows:



There is no e-mail address. She has asked that all correspondence include the Court of Appeals Number on all correspondence. That number is Court of Appeals No. 43585-II ← ROMAN 2

On June 26 she wrote that the Superior Court has 60 days to supply transcripts of the trial, then she has 45 days after transcripts are filed to file an appellate brief. So I assume that is already done. Then the prosecutor has 60 days to file a Brief of Respondent. So we have reached the end of the 165 days about now.

Arnold wrote: "You will also have the option to submit your own Statement in

addition to the brief your attorney submits. Please see Rule of Appellate Procedure 70.10 for more information on filing a pro se Statement of "additional grounds for review (SAGR)." <sup>11</sup>

She also writes, "This office will not contact your family member(s) or friend(s) to discuss your appeal."

So, after I have reviewed Mr. Arnold's brief, I want to look at the transcripts of the trial (and the hearing for the motion to suppress) and see how what you've written fits in. I believe your analysis of the search warrant affidavit will be a response to the Judge's overreaching comments at that pre-trial hearing to suppress.

I have 30 days to file the ~~the~~ pro se Statement, after the date I am served my attorney's appellate brief. I am guessing that will come soon, so you may want to send me a copy of what you have.

Also, I have not yet received the books you were going to order for me. Those would be the <sup>1</sup>Book of Mormon, <sup>2</sup>Doctrine & Covenants/ Pearl of Great Price, <sup>3</sup>the church almanac. I

Also, I spoke to some people here. Evidently hardbacks are OK. One of the guys here has a hardbound dictionary. I recall being told at Challam Bay Correctional Center hardbacks are not allowed because the inmates can weaponize them. But we have them in the Unit library, and I know the women's prison has mostly hardbacks in the library. The librarians here and at the women's prison are well-stocked. The library at Challam Bay Correctional Center (maximum security) was empty when I toured that facility. It was a nice big empty room with shelves along the walls.

Anyway, I am anxious to send out some letters, and hopefully get positive responses. So, please help!
