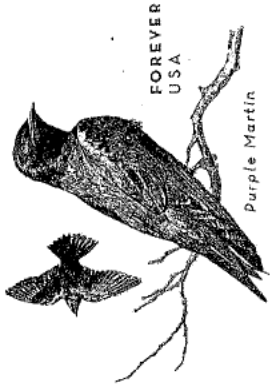

Dear Alina,

I hope you opened this as soon as you got it, and didn't leave it for days. As you well know, the money ran out on the phone, ~~I~~ and I haven't been able to even call you for days.

I am going to put my home address in as my next prospective release address. I don't see why it would not be approved. I will be making back in anyway if the conviction is returned, or as soon as the probation ends, whichever comes first. Even if they don't approve it as a release address. If they don't allow me to move there next year when my map is up, I may ~~just~~ just live in my van until someone gets their head out of their ass.

For now, when the counselor ([redacted]) calls, if she calls (I don't know if this woman does anything, and most of the inmates in her wing wonder the same thing) go ahead and tell her it's OK. If [redacted] is concerned she can move out of my house as I move back in.

Anyway, there are no police searches authorized just because I am there. The community corrections officer can do a walk through, but not an intrusive search.

I plan to take the room next to the bathroom downstairs. Since you have turned the master suite into a storage room. Put the rollaway bed in there for now. Let the CCo in to do their breeze through. I'm not restricted by the Judgment and Sentence from alcohol, so you don't have to dispose of the beer or wine.

I will feel more comfortable if I can be around family, close to you and [REDACTED]. At my age I need family support more than the average person who's leaving this institution.

Anyway, let's do whatever we can so that I can come home.
