

Christmas Dinner Tablescape

with Heartland Paper
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Centerpiece: Circle Trees

Circle Trees from Martha Stewart Living Magazine (December Issue)

Supplies Needed:

Patterned Papers in varying shades of Green
Circle Cutter or Circle templates
Dowel and wood base painted brown
Hot Glue
Bone Folder



Instructions:

Step 1 For large Christmas trees, use an adjustable circle cutter to make 12, 10, 8, 6 and 4-inch-diameter circles from green pattern paper. For small trees, make a 8, 6, 5, 4, 3 inch circles.

Step 2 Fold each circle in half 4 times with a bone folder (top). While circles are folded, snip off the tip of each piece, forming a very small hole in center.

Step 3 Place smallest circle on the pointed end of a wooden dowel. With a hot-glue gun, dab underside of circle, where paper and dowel meet. Hold for 10 seconds to secure.

Step 4 Working 1 at a time from smallest circle to largest, slide remaining circles onto dowel; secure with glue

Step 5 Insert bottom of dowel into a spool; remove, and cut dowel to desired height, secure with glue

Candle

Supplies Needed:

Patterned Paper, Cardstock, Ribbon, Martha Stewart Scallop Border Punch, McGill Pine Bough Punch

Instructions:

1. Cut Pattern paper to about 2" (can be smaller or larger depending on your candle).

2. Using border punch, punch cardstock edge.

3. Wrap cardstock and patterned paper around candle.

4. Tie ribbon around patterned paper.

5. Cut two pine bough punches from cardstock and tuck into ribbon.

Paper Placemat

Supplies Needed:

1-12X12 Patterned Paper

3 Coordinating colors of 12X12 cardstock

Adhesive

Martha Stewart Scallop Border Punch

Instructions:

Step 1 Using border punch, punch edge of 2- 2" strips of each cardstock color

Step 2 Adhere border punched strips onto outer edges of 12X12 patterned paper so that it looks like a ruffle edge.



Napkin Ring

Supplies Needed:

1 1/2" X 5" strip of Patterned Paper

1X5" strip of coordinating cardstock

Green cardstock

Ribbon

Adhesive

Martha Stewart Scallop Border Punch

Pine Bough Punch

Instructions:

Step 1 Using border punch, punch edge of cardstock strip

Step 2 Wrap cardstock and patterned paper around rolled napkin.

Step 3 Wrap ribbon around paper

Step 2 Punch two pine boughs from green paper- tuck into ribbon



Glass with vinyl lettering and name tag

Supplies Needed:

Fluted glass, Silhouette Digital Cutter and Red Vinyl, Two Colors Coordinating

Cardstock, Scallop circle punch (Marvy Uchida), Slightly smaller

round circle punch (EK Success), Pine Bough Punch, Red Glitter Glue

Ribbon

Instructions for vinyl lettering:

Step 1 Using Silhouette Digital cutter, cut desired letters from rolled vinyl. Adhere vinyl to cup

Instructions for name tag:

Step 1 Using scallop circle punch, cut circle from one color cardstock

Step 2 Print or type names onto coordinating color cardstock and cut out using plain circle punch.

Step 3 punch two pine boughs from green cardstock- adhere to name card

Step 2 Use red glitter glue to make three berries on pine bough- tie onto glass with ribbon.



Side Dish or Condiment Picks

Supplies Needed:

Two Colors Coordinating, toothpicks
Cardstock, Scallop circle punch (Marvy Uchida), Slightly smaller
round circle punch (EK Success), Pine Bough Punch, Red Glitter Glue
Ribbon, adhesive

Instructions:

Step 1 Using scallop circle punch, cut two circles from one color cardstock

Step 2 Print or type side dish or condiment name onto coordinating color cardstock and cut out using plain circle punch.

Step 3 punch two pine boughs from green cardstock- adhere to edges of printed circles

Step 4 Use red glitter glue to make three berries on pine bough

Step 5 adhere scalloped circles to both sides of toothpick so that it is double sided

Step 6 place in condiments and side dishes to identify them to guests.
